



As an active participant in the Senior Program, you are required to comply with the partnership agreement as well as complete program requirements.

Seniors who complete the program receive a special designation on their transcript and in their graduation program, are invited to an honors gala, and given the opportunity to apply for last dollar grant funding.

The primary purpose of the Crosby Scholars Program is to help prepare scholars for successful college enrollment. By completing the program's requirements, we believe you will achieve your goal of attending a college or university of your choice.

Senior Scholars must do the following to remain active in the program:

- 1. Attend a first individual senior meeting typically held during the summer. Your meeting must be scheduled by July 19th. The purpose of this meeting is to review your high school transcript, to confirm your target list of colleges, and to discuss your college plans upon high school graduation. You are required to bring the following documents to this meeting including: target list of colleges with campus visit plans, draft of activities resume, SAT/ACT scores and plans to retake either, and names of individuals to consider asking for a letter of recommendation.
- 2. Fulfill the terms of the Partnership Agreement. Please note that you will be dismissed from the Program if you are suspended or excluded from school.
- Participate in the *It's My Call/It's Our Call* drug screening. Scholars selected for drug screening are expected to participate. The selection is random which means a scholar may or may not be selected when drug screening is conducted. Should a Scholar test positive he/she is required to contact Insight Human Services to schedule an assessment. Any scholar testing positive must follow a prescribed treatment in order to remain active in the Crosby Scholars Program.
- 4. Attend Senior Advisor meetings throughout the school year to complete all conference notes forms. Seniors and advisors schedule the meetings together. Seniors assigned to an advisor will meet with the advisor at school during the school day.
- 5. Seniors have two options to fulfill the college fair/visit requirement. You may either attend a college fair and speak to four college reps at the fair OR visit four college campuses and attend an admission session on each campus. You must take the College Visit form with you to get signed by each admissions representative. The College Fair/College Visit form must be turned in prior to or on the night of the 2019 College fair in September.
- 6. Complete at least two hours of community service and submit a signed community service form or verification of community service by January 31, 2020. Forms signed by your parent will <u>not</u> be accepted.
- 7. Attend two Crosby Senior Academies. Credit for Crosby Senior Academy is given to scholars who arrive at the academy/log into the webinar on time; who sign in at on-site sessions; stay/remain online for the entire academy and submit a confirmation of attendance form at the end of the academy. A schedule of the Crosby Senior Academies is distributed on August 1. Permission is not granted to arrive late or to leave early.
- 8. Complete the program with a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative weighted grade point average to be eligible to apply for a last dollar grant.
- 9. Maintain enrollment in and graduate from a Forsyth County public school (except HBI program participants).
