REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIORS

Seniors who complete the Crosby Scholars program receive a special designation on their transcript and in their graduation program, are invited to an honors gala, and given the opportunity to apply for last dollar grant funding.

The primary purpose of the Crosby Scholars Program is to help prepare scholars for successful college enrollment. By completing the program's requirements, we believe you will achieve your goal of attending a college or university of your choice.

As an active participant in the Senior Program, you are required to comply with the partnership agreement as well as complete program requirements. Senior Scholars must do the following to remain active in the program:

- 1. Attend a senior summer meeting typically held during the summer months- Virtual Meetings in 2020. Specific instructions have been sent directly to students. There are several ways to schedule the summer meeting, please review the emails and texts with your specific instructions. All meetings should take place by the end of August. The purpose of this meeting is to review your high school transcript, to confirm your target list of colleges, and to discuss your college plans upon high school graduation. It will be helpful to bring target list of colleges, draft of activities resume, SAT/ACT scores and plans to retake either, and names of individuals to consider asking for a letter of recommendation.
- Attend Senior Advisor meetings throughout the school year to complete all conference notes forms.
 Seniors and advisors schedule the meetings together. The fall 2020 advisor meeting specifics will be announced later this summer.
- 3. **Fulfill the college fair/visit requirement.** Students may have already completed this requirement beginning in the 10th grade year. As of the spring of 2020 and until college admissions offices reopen, students are eligible to complete the college fair/visit requirement through virtual visits at this time. - 4. Complete at least two hours of community service and submit a community service form or verification of community service by January 31, 2021. We encourage students to submit the online form to complete their community service requirement. - 5. **Attend two Crosby Senior Academies.** Credit for Crosby Senior Academy is given to scholars who arrive at the academy/log into the webinar on time; who sign in at on-site sessions; stay/remain online for the entire academy and submit a confirmation of attendance form at the end of the academy. Academies will begin July 2020.
- 6. **Fulfill the terms of the Partnership Agreement.** Please note that you will be dismissed from the Program if you are suspended or excluded from school.
- 7. Participate in the It's My Call/It's Our Call. Scholars selected for drug screening are expected to participate. The selection is random which means a scholar may or may not be selected when drug screening is conducted. Should a Scholar test positive he/she is required to contact Insight Human Services to schedule an assessment. Any scholar testing positive must follow a prescribed treatment in order to remain active in the Crosby Scholars Program.
- 8. Complete the program with a minimum of a 2.0 cumulative weighted grade point average to be eligible to apply for a last dollar grant.
- 9. Maintain enrollment in and graduate from a Forsyth County public school (except HBI program participants).
