Financial Basics can be used in conjunction with teacher-led curricula, as part of a





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ACT

The ACT measures skills in English, math, reading, and science reasoning. You'll receive a score on each section and a composite score between 1 and 36. The ACT is offered during the school day for free to juniors at NC public high schools, otherwise it costs approximately \$40.

SAT

The SAT measures critical thinking skills using questions in two categories: Evidenced-Based Reading and Writing, and Math. The total possible score range is 400-1600, and it costs approximately \$26.



College Redirection Pool

CFNC.org/Redirection

What is it?

The College Redirection Pool is a system that can help students find colleges that have open admissions slots. The pool works differently than the standard admissions process. Instead of students completing an application and trying to convince a college that they are the right candidate for admittance, colleges recruit students. This means that students may be contacted by colleges that were not on their initial radar or that they didn't even know about before using the system, giving students more options in the latter half of their senior year than they may have expected.

How does it work?

CFNC's College Redirection Pool becomes available to students on April 1 and can be used until August 31. To take advantage of this option, students create a profile through CFNC.org with all of their credentials, including GPA, test scores, and extracurricular activities. This profile is then available to various colleges and universities throughout North Carolina.

Colleges can reach out to the students who meet their specific admissions requirements and recruit them to attend. After reviewing all of the information that colleges provide, the student can then choose to apply to the school officially, making the process easier and less stressful.

Who participates?

Both two-year and four-year institutions utilize this resource to serve more students so there are a lot of different options available to students who are looking to continue their education in the fall.

If your original plan for college fell through, or if you are starting the application process a little later, the College Redirection Pool is a perfect way to learn about different colleges that still have open spots and get a better idea of what options are out there for you. Using this resource will provide you with information about many different colleges and will help you make the most informed decision about your next step.





The Aubrey Lee Brooks Scholarship

THE AUBREY LEE BROOKS FOUNDATION

BACKGROUND



Aubrey Lee Brooks was born in Person County on May 21, 1871. Despite his later success and wealth, he never failed to acknowledge his indebtedness and gratitude to the community into which he was born.

My mother...watched over me like a guardian angel. Her constant admonition was that I must, at

whatever sacrifice, acquire a college education. But that took money, and we had no money.

After graduating high school, Mr. Brooks taught in a singleroom school. After two years, with his savings—and some borrowed money—he went to Chapel Hill to attend the University. A brief illness interrupted his studies but his love for the law returned him to Chapel Hill.

None of my family on either side had ever been a lawyer, but for some unaccountable reason I was consumed with an ambition to become one.²

As a prosecuting attorney for the State and later in private practice at his firm in Greensboro, he was esteemed for his wide-ranging knowledge of the law, his skill as a general practitioner and his abiding belief in justice and fairness.

Throughout his life, Mr. Brooks was active in North Carolina politics and contributed to many worthy causes in the state, including the Boy Scouts, the Presbyterian Church, and the UNC Press.

Aubrey Lee Brooks lived in North Carolina until his death on January 10, 1958. Prior to his death, he endowed the Trust which funds this scholarship program. In keeping with his commitment to community, the counties in and around the old Imperial Fifth Congressional District are the chief beneficiaries of this scholarship bearing his name.

APPLICATION PROCESS

There are three steps required to apply for the Aubrey Lee Brooks Scholarship. Each applicant must:

- Apply for college admission and be accepted as an undergraduate student at one of the qualifying institutions:
 - North Carolina State University (NCSU)
 - University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill (UNCCH)
 - University of North Carolina at Greensboro (UNCG)
- Apply for financial aid by completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at FAFSA.gov. To be considered the applicant must list at least one of the qualifying institutions.
- Complete the Brooks Scholarship application available online at CFNC.org/Brooks

The applicant must use his/her College Foundation of North Carolina (CFNC) account to complete the application; CFNC is a free service of the state of North Carolina.

ELIGIBILITY & DEADLINE

To be eligible, an applicant must be a North Carolina resident and a graduating high school senior permanently residing in one of the following counties:

Alamance Orange
Bertie Person
Caswell Rockingham
Durham Stokes
Forsyth Surry
Granville Swain
Guilford Warren

All application materials must be received by January 31st.
Only complete applications demonstrating financial need and academic excellence will be considered.

APPLICATION PROCESS

Seventeen Brooks Scholarships are awarded annually to graduating seniors from the 14 specified counties on the basis of

academic standing, character, leadership, financial need, and the will of the recipient to help himself or herself prepare for a career as a useful and informed citizen.³

Applicants must demonstrate financial need. Financial need is determined by the Brooks Foundation based on the information submitted on the FAFSA form.

Selection for the Brooks Scholarship is competitive. Successful applicants have excellent high school grades and SAT/ACT scores. Applicants are expected to have participated in extracurricular activities, volunteered in their community and/or been regularly employed. These students often demonstrate leadership within the organizations with which they work.

Eligible applicants are interviewed by each county's committee. Each county committee submits finalist recommendations to the Foundation's Central Scholarship Committee which selects the recipients. Decisions are announced in April.

VALUE AND TERMS

The Aubrey Lee Brooks Scholarship provides an award up to approximately one-half of the cost of an undergraduate education. The scholarship, in combination with any other financial assistance the student receives, may not exceed the cost of attendance at the institution. In the fall of his/her first year, each scholar receives an additional one-time allowance to purchase a computer for school use.

The scholarship is renewable for three additional academic years (a total of eight semesters) provided the recipient has continued financial need, is enrolled full-time, maintains a GPA of at least 2.75 and demonstrates good citizenship.










NC Forgivable Education Loan for Service (FELS)




