Keynote Speaker

Lee H. Roberts

13th Chancellor of the University of
North Carolina at Chapel Hill

Lee H. Roberts is the 13th chancellor of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, appointed on August 9, 2024, after serving as interim chancellor since January 2024. As chancellor, he serves as the chief executive of the nation's first public university, leading a global R1 research institution with a \$4.5 billion budget and a community of nearly 45,000 students, faculty and staff.



A longtime advocate for higher education and public service, Roberts previously served as North Carolina's state budget director under Governor Pat McCrory, has been a member of the UNC System Board of Governors (chairing its budget committee), and has held various leadership roles across several statewide boards. Before becoming interim chancellor, he taught public budgeting at Duke University and was co-founder and managing partner of SharpVue Capital, a North Carolina-based private investment firm.

Chancellor Roberts has prioritized initiatives in generative AI, applied sciences, enrollment growth and campus master planning, among others. He is committed to advancing UNC-Chapel Hill's mission, emphasizing its role as a cornerstone of North Carolina's future, and actively engages with students and faculty, drawing on his public service background and deep respect for the University's traditions.
